The Arena requires that shavings be used in all stalls prior to a horse entering the stall. NO OTHER BEDDING IS ALLOWED. If bedding, other than shavings is found, Arena will charge the exhibitor \$50 EXTRA PER STALL. Shavings are not included in stall fee but may be purchased on your entry form and will be at your stall when you arrive. All exhibitors are to bring their own horse handling equipment, food and hay. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls. No changes will be permitted except with the consent of the Barn Superintendent. Only one horse allowed per stall except for brood mares and suckling foals. If you wish to be stalled next to someone specific please indicate such on your entry form.

ARENA RULES PROHIBIT THE DISMANTLING OF ANY STALL EQUIPMENT.

RESPONSIBILITY

All entries will be accepted with the understanding that the CSPHC, NAPHA and the Mississippi Horse Park will not be responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or any articles of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Manager, but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any injury to any person or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall I indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kink or nature including attorney fees and court cost, that may arise out of any injury occasioned by an cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of any such horse.

Checks are to be made payable to THE CENTRAL STATES PERUVIAN HORSE CLUB (CSPHC) and mailed with the entry form to the address listed herein. The management agrees to cancel and return entry fees of any horse not fit to show, providing the request is made in writing and a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian is received by the show management before the close of the show, stating the disability for the show dates. In this case another horse from the same stables may be substituted and class fees transferred. Previous Champion or Champion of Champions from a CSPHC or NAPHA National Show MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED on the official entry form and received by the May 1st, 2016 deadline.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES REQUIRED

All horses entering the show grounds must have a health certificate with a copy of a current coggins (within 12 months). Papers MUST be checked before horses are unloaded. The State of Mississippi and the Tunica Arena and Expo Center require a health certificate signed by a veterinarian within 30 days of the show. Health certificates shall reflect the recorded boy temperature and coggins test at the time the certificate is issued.

STABLING FACILITY

Stalls will be ready for us Thursday May 12, 2016 after 8:00 AM and must be vacated by 9:00 AM on Monday May 16, 2016. Arrangements for keeping horses at the show grounds before Thursday and after Monday must be made by prior arrangements with the Show and/or Barn Superintendent. Early arrival and late departure fees must be paid in advance. Fees for early arrival or late departure are \$12.00 per stall per day. Stalls must be reserved by submitting a proper entry form and payment of fees. Stalls cannot be reserved by phone unless advance payment has been made. If needing earlier arrival you must contact the barn manager to make arrangements.

ULTIMATE HORSE AWARD

All contestants must declare their intentions to compete for this award prior to the start of the show. Place class numbers in the Ultimate Horse section on your entry form. Each horse must enter a breeding, gait, performance and one qualifying bonus class of exhibitors choice. A fee of \$10.00 per class will be added to the normal class fee for these 4 classes. Qualifying classes are identified with a UH. Points will be counted from the four selected classes. A CASH PRIZE OF \$500 will be the prize. Horses going for the Ultimate Horse Award will NOT have their past champion or champion of champion standing effected.

SILENT AUCTION

Proceeds from our silent auction support the case prize for our Geldings Purse class with a \$300 purse guaranteed. Payout will be paid 1st through the 5th place. See the Purse Classes section for payout percentages. Please help support our efforts with your auction contributions. Use your imagination!!! Big or small, horse related or non. Perhaps you have a service to donate, art work or a special craft. If you do not have an item or service to donate feel free to donate cash \$\$. You may make your cash donations in the show office. Anything will be appreciated. Auction closes at noon Sunday at which time successful bidders will be announced.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

This show is open to all horses registered with NAPHA, (formerly PPHRNA & AAOBPPH) or the PHAC. Horses must be entered based upon the current, registration papers, registered owner and full registered name and number. Horses must be entered under the full registered name.

Male horses 4 years of age and older **must be** registered as a stallion or gelding. Registration papers indicating "male" **will not** be considered acceptable registration papers. The only exception will be male horses entered in Colts 3-4 Bozal.

Spayed mares may not be shown as a breeding mare.

As you can see we are allowing juniors to compete against ALL entries in this show for class 40 and 49. However, Helmet and tack rules will be followed...

The Barrell Race will be a timed event, and will be performed one horse at a time.

Safety is foremost and will be closely scrutinized by our monitors.

FUN is the key word here Juniors, and if you have any questions, please reach out to one of our Committee members.

REMEMBER....

Juniors are the future of our breed....

Come out to support them!!

Be sure and enter the Egg Stomp! You all line up on your horse, go across the arena, have your horse stomp an egg and return to where you started before anyone else! It is lots of fun to do and to watch!

SHOW APPROVAL AND POINTS

This show has been approved by the **North American Peruvian Horse Association** (NAPHA). This show will earn a minimum of double pints for NAPHA Awards if the recorded owner (s) of the horse is/are a current member of NAPHA at the time of the show-Year End Awards-Medallion de Plata, High Point Performance Horse/Gelding, Zone 4 and Lifetime Awards-Medallion de Oro, Bronze and Diamante.

- -Only one set of ribbons and trophies will be given for lead line classes as there are no points involved.
- -Points for the Versatility, Junior High Point, Amateur Owner to Ride and the Ultimate Horse will be determined by the NAPHA point system. The highest four classes will be used to determine award points for each entry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The best adjudication officials to be found have been selected and will place awards on the entries as they see them presented in the ring, without regard to previous records or performance.

-All participants are responsible for a knowledge of and are subject to the current Rules and Regulations of NAPHA. All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class description of tack, attire, rules/regulations, conduct, ethics and conditions for this show are described in the above named publication. You may obtain a copy by calling

707-544-5857 or by going to the NAPHA website at www.NAPHA.net.

- -We expect all exhibitors to keep their horses drug free
- -Declaration of Amateur Status must be on file for anyone who is competing in the Amateur Performance or the Amateur Owner Performance Divisions. Forms will be available in the Show Office.
- -To qualify for a Novice class the exhibitor may not have already won more than 5 blue ribbons. Novice declaration forms will be available in the Show Office.

NAPHA membership forms are also available in the show office.

JUNIORS

Junior Division are ages 6through 12 and 13 through 18. A Junior's age is counted as his/her age on January 1 of the current year.

- -All Junior classes will be run at the same time but be judged as separate age groups. Age splits will be made before results are announced and sent to NAPHA for points.
- -NAPHA RULES FOR JUNIORS Retrancas are prohibited, baticola is required, floron is optional. Leather stirrups (tapaderos) may be used and no spurs are allowed in the Junior classes. Lead line exhibitors should be 6 and under and helmets are required. Helmets are optional in all other Junior classes.

NO UNGELDED COLTS over 12 months old are allowed in any Junior class. Juniors must be at least 15 years old and **must have written parental consent** to show stallions in adult classes or to ride in the barrida at the end of the show.

- **-JUNIOR PERFORMANCE CLASSES** Juniors may be requested to stop, back, reverse, do circles to the left and to the right. Juniors may also be asked to show something special they can do with their horse.
- **-JUNIOR EQUITATION CLASS** No spurs or ponchos are permitted. Juniors may be requested to stop, back, circle to the left and to the right, do figure eights and serpentine, at the Judge's option.

PURSE CLASSES

All purse classes will be paid at the following percentages:

1st place 40%, 2nd place 30%, 3rd place 15%, 4th place 10%, 5th place 5%.

AOTR purse is \$250 and Junior Purse is \$75.00 Egg Stomp Purse is limited to the entry fees and any donations.

See Silent Auction section for Geldings Purse information.

TACK

Please see NAPHA show rules for full and detailed requirements. Show management an/or Judges may eliminate those contestants who do not conform to the rules on tack, attire and appointments.

-<u>PERUVIAN</u> - Bozal tack to consist of Peruvian Bozal, halter, eye covers, saddle with carona, crupper with tail cover, and stirrups (no pellon, poncho or spurs). **In the Bit** tack to consist of Peruvian bridle and bit, halter, eye covers, saddle with carona, crupper with tail cover and stirrups. Pellon and Peruvian type spurs are optional.

<u>WESTERN</u> - Saddle must be western type. For "In the Bit" classes the bridle may be Peruvian (without halter and eye covers or any western headstall without a noseband, in conjunction with any standard western type bit. A Peruvian bit is acceptable with a western headset. For Bozal classes a Peruvian type bozal will also be permitted.

<u>PLANTATION</u> - Plantation type saddle with either English or Peruvian bridle or Peruvian Bozal in specified classes.

ATTIRE

Although versatility in tack is permitted, the acceptable attire shall be limited to while long sleeve shirts, white pants, poncho or jacket, white scarf, brown or black boots and belts and a Peruvian type hat. Attire exception in class 36

Bozal Classes—No pellon, spurs or poncho.

Breeding & Performance Classes - Ponchos or jackets are required. Pellon use is optional.

Spurs are optional but must be Peruvian type if used. No English spurs will be permitted.

SUPPORT THE SILENT AUCTION

-A horse may not be shown in bit and Bozal in the same show

Bozal horses may not be shown in Performance, Bareback, Novice or Junior Classes.

-Horses may be entered in both Performance and Breeding divisions

-Past Champions and National Champions entered directly into the Champion of Champion class must be pre-entered by May 1, 2016.

Every horse entered will be issued a number, which must be worn by the rider/handler of this horse in all classes.

SHOW SPECIFICS

All fees are listed on the back of the entry form No ponchos will be allowed in the equitation classes. Jackets may be worn. Side-saddles are welcome in the Costume Class. The Jr. Soda class will not be judged as a race. Exhibitors will remain in the competition until the end of the class.

Judges Authority

The Judge shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The Judge shall award prizes in order starting with first place and may not vacate places. Five horses will be placed with a reserve. If there are more horses of merit in a class than there are prizes offered, the Judge has the right to award any number of honorable mentions.

-The Judge may excuse a horse from a class due to conduct or lameness or failure to gait, **NOT FOR QUALITY.**

The Judge has the right to make favorable comments over the PA system about the horses shown before him but shall not make any negative comments.

-Stripping of horses in Champion of Champion classes is at the Judge's discretion.

In the event that a Judge or other official designated herein is unable to perform his/her duties due to circumstances beyond their control, the CSPPHC reserves the right to substitute another Judge or official in his/her place.

RING ADMISSION STEWARD

The ring admissions steward shall call to the attention of the Show Steward or Show Veterinarian any entry which does not, in his opinion, conform to the rules regarding hoof length, tack, attire, appearance and soundness. The Show Steward and/or Show Vet shall investigate and handle such matters.

CALL FOR CLASSES

Classes will be called promptly and with advance notice before each preceding class enters the ring. THREE MINUTES will be allowed after the gate is opened.

ALL EXHIBITORS SHOULD BE ON THEIR WAY TO THE CLASS ON THE SECOND CALL.

-If a tack change is required because of cross entering and a rider cannot make the three minute ruling for a final call, he/she should request additional time by submitting a TACK CHANGE REQUEST, on forms that are available in the show office, prior to the class in question. Tack changes will be seven minutes from the time the last horse of the preceding class leaves the ring.

CLASS CONDUCT

Exhibitors will enter the ring and proceed counter clockwise at his/her best gait and await further instruction. There will be only one line up at the end of the class.

CONDUCT AND SAFETY

The CSPPHC expects the highest standards of ethics from its exhibitors and those persons under their authority. Exhibitors shall at all times take whatever steps necessary to protect themselves, their horses and the viewing public.

No person will be permitted to enter the ring except participants in the class, the Judge, and his assistants. Attendants, suitably dressed in whites, will be permitted in the ring if summoned by the Judge. Exhibitors shall at all times take whatever steps necessary to protect themselves, their horses and the viewing public.

Exhibitors are warned that any act of disobedience or discourtesy to the officials on the part of an owner, groom, rider, handler or member of the family of persons participating in the show may disqualify them or their horses. The management reserves to itself the right to remove a groom, rider, or handler from the show without being liable for compensation for damages. It is the tradition of the show ring that an exhibitor be correctly attired for the class in question, that the attendants be neatly dressed and horses be properly groomed and presented. The management, at its discretion, may bar any person or entry from entering the ring if not suitably attired to appear before the public.

SMOKING, ALCOHOL AND PARKING SIGNS MUST BE ADHERED TO. NO EXCEPTIONS.

-All dogs on the grounds shall be leashed or confined. NO DOGS will be allowed in the arena with exception of the dog participating in the flag presentation.
